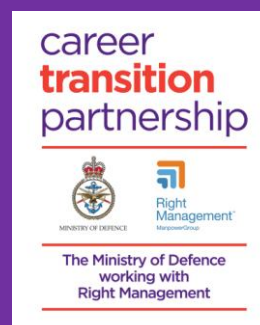

Regional Business News

A brief round-up of all the most important stories of regional business information for London & the South East



InterContinental Hotels Group

Intercontinental Hotels are building a striking new hotel set in Westminster, London's Royal and political heartland. Within easy walking distance of Buckingham Palace, the Houses of Parliament and Westminster Abbey, this will be a stunning addition to the InterContinental collection. The hotel is due to be ready by Oct 2012 and will be looking to hire staff from entry level right up to Managerial, salaries will be competitive with bonus and incentive schemes.



Luton Airport - Plans to almost double the number of passengers going through Luton Airport could create as many as 6,000 new jobs. The airport handles nearly 10m passengers a year at present and will submit an application to increase this 18m. The project is being branded as futureLuToN:Optimisation, and begins a four-week consultation process on 6 February.

Councillor Robin Harris, chair of London Luton Airport Ltd (LLAL), the company that owns the airport on behalf of Luton Borough Council, says: "The benefits that will flow from the airport's development will be realised in the local, regional and national economies. "I am encouraged by the vast majority of people and businesses in Luton and the wider region who believe strongly that the airport is a terrific asset for job creation and our biggest wealth creator



More than 100 major UK businesses have signed up to a government initiative that proposes asking for CVs without the name or the school details of candidates in order to remove the risk of discrimination during the application process. Firms such as Tesco, Barclays and Coca-Cola have agreed to the Government's Business Compact, which requires them to recruit "fairly and without discrimination" by using application forms that don't allow candidates to be screened out due to the school

they went to or their ethnicity. The agreement adds that this could be done through "name-blank" and "school-blank" applications, as both of these fields could result in the candidate facing discrimination during the hiring process. Other elements of the agreement include advertising work experience placements to people of different backgrounds online and in schools, instead of giving places to "informal contacts", and providing financial support or paying the national minimum wage to interns. The compact is part of Deputy Prime Minister Nick Clegg's social mobility strategy, which aims to create a "what you know, not who you know" recruitment culture. Clegg commented: "Working with the coalition, the biggest hitters in British business are helping lead the way to a fairer, more open society. "By opening their doors to young people from all walks of life, this marks the start of a culture shift among major employers, driven by the belief that ability and drive should trump connections and

privilege." While more than 100 UK businesses, including major finance firms, law firms, high street retailers, energy firms and manufacturers have agreed to the compact, Clegg will be writing to 50 more of the biggest UK companies asking them to sign up. Jeya Thiruchelvam, employment law editor at XpertHR, said that the anonymous CV plans were a "step in the right direction".

Thiruchelvam explained: "Removing an applicant's name will, in some cases, prevent employers from making shortlisting decisions based on a person's national/ethnic origins. While in other cases, an applicant's national/ethnic origins will be evident from their educational and work history so the measure will have limited effect. "The real challenge remains dealing effectively with conscious and unconscious discrimination that the applicant may face once they are before the interviewer."



HS2 - Hopes that tens of thousands of jobs will be created by proposed rail link High Speed Two (HS2) have been raised as the transport secretary has approved plans for the project. A statement from government-created HS2 Ltd., says the scheme will "create thousands of jobs", while a Department for Transport (DfT) leaflet says: "Tens of thousands of new jobs... particularly at Old Oak Common in West London and Birmingham's Eastside."

Old Oak Common is within the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham (H&F), and the borough states that "at least 20,000 jobs" would arrive in that area alone, with London as a whole seeing 40,000 jobs "directly associated" with HS2, according to a House of Commons Transport Committee in November 2011. A spokesperson for the borough adds these are "official Department for Transport figures", mentioning a report from town planner SKM Colin Buchanan saying the project would "potentially generate over 115,000 jobs" across the wider North-West London, with the H&F spokesperson calling this a "conservative estimate." Birmingham City Council says that 22,000 West Midlands jobs will result from HS2 "plus associated improvements". Councillor Mark Loveday, H&F Council cabinet member for strategy, says: "HS2 is the fastest way to deliver much need new homes, jobs and opportunities in one of London's poorest areas and the Government has recognised that the case for the Old Oak interchange is overwhelming." According to H&F, roughly 50% of working ages adults living in the proximity of Old Oak are unemployed, with some parts of the area in the top 1% of most deprived areas nationally. Mike Whitby, leader of Birmingham City Council, calls HS2 "probably the single most important opportunity for economic growth in this region for generations." A spokesperson for HS2 says that the construction of the project is scheduled for 2017-25, ready to open in 2026.

Avman, an aircraft engineering firm is to create eight jobs after landing a major contract.

Amid rising unemployment and job losses elsewhere, Avman unveiled the news confirming its plan to take on eight more engineers at its Manston Airport base.

Avman has signed a three-year deal with Falko, a UK aircraft asset management company, for the storage, care and maintenance of up to six Avro RJ regional jet aircraft each year.



The west wing of the University of Portsmouth's Eldon building is to be built by national construction firm Morgan Sindall. The £9m deal will see a 13,454 sq ft five-storey extension of the existing building which will provide a new gallery, as well as social, learning and teachings areas for students studying in the Faculty of Creative and Cultural Industries. Construction of the extension is due to be completed in May 2013



Greene King which runs 134 pubs and restaurants in Hampshire has reported a rise in half-year profits and has announced 3,000 new jobs as it gears up for more growth. Greene King also owns Hungry Horse, Old English Inns and the Loch Fyne Restaurants chains. 1,330 people work in Hampshire in roles including food development, catering, bar staff and management. They want to create 3,000 new jobs over 3 years as part of plans to boost its estate to 1,100 managed pubs and restaurants, up from 950 currently. 100's of jobs could be created in Hampshire.



Southampton Accountants BDO have helped broker the sale of £61m turnover Integrated Cleaning Management Ltd (ICM) to catering and support services provider Compass Group. Hampshire based ICM, one of the UK's largest independent specialist providers of core cleanings and related services, employs 8,000 staff who work on more than 3,800 client sites. The acquisition is considered to be a sensible and strategic move for both parties.
