Course Fees and How to Fund

The course is Contract-Funded. This means that no money is required for course fees, but the IRTC Grant reduces by £133.50 (5 Days IRTC). Students will require an up-to-date BS 7671 Wiring Regulations book which can be purchased at a discounted rate of £67 from the RTC. The examination fee of £62 is a non-refundable payment taken when booking. SLC or IRTC may be used to cover exam fees.
