### Level 3 Award in Education and Training

- ✓ Gain the entry level nationally recognised qualification required to deliver training to Further Education adults or apprenticeship programmes
- ✓ Obtain the necessary skills and knowledge to prepare, plan, deliver and evaluate basic teaching and learning sessions in a variety of teaching or training contexts within the civilian education & training sector
- ✓ An ideal qualification for anyone who has military instructional experience and would like to convert the experience into a nationally recognised qualification

## Who is the course for?

The course is open to all Service personnel and is especially geared towards those who would like to begin a career in the training / education sector.

In many cases those qualified with the Level 3 Award in EAT will be able to deliver training in any subject that you are 'competent\*' in (competent can mean relevant experience or qualifications)

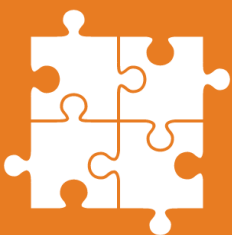


\*competency will be determined by the employer.

## Course Structure

Delivered over 10 days, successful Service leaders will receive the BTEC Level 3 Award in Education and Training.

The course aims to develop confidence and competence in teaching people over the age of 16, giving them the opportunity to:



- ◆ Develop knowledge related to teaching and learning
- ◆ Develop skills in teaching and learning
- ◆ Achieve a nationally recognised Level 3 qualification
- ◆ Develop their own personal growth and engagement in teaching and learning

You will be assessed throughout the course by a mixture of short theoretical and practical tasks.

## What support will I receive?

Support is provided throughout the course by the tutors and although there is no required pre-course reading, students may find the following book useful:

## Further Study



A natural progression to this course would be the NVQ Assessor Award (Level 3) which is delivered by CTP at RRC Cottesmore. This provides candidates the required qualification to assess NVQs and apprenticeship programmes.

## Employment Opportunities

There are many opportunities available in the training industry for roles such as Company Trainer, Training Manager, Training Consultant, Learning and Development Consultant or Manager and this qualification accompanied by the relevant experience from the military would enable a strong CV for these roles.



## Course Fees and How to Fund

The course is Contract-Funded. This means that no money is required for course fees, but the IRTC Grant reduces by £267.00 (10 Days IRTC).



Course Cost (10 days)	£267.00
Exam Fees	£86.76
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Total cost:	£353.76

Students who have used their IRTC allocation or are post-discharge can apply for a Standby place on the course. If offered a place via current Standby arrangements, students will pay £267.00 directly to the MoD Cashiers Office on the first day of the course.

The exam fee for this course costs £86.76 and this is paid to an external body therefore Service leavers will be required to pay this directly to the CBIC no later than 6 weeks prior to the course start date.
